The Kurt Aaron Oration: Professor Matthew Sanders

The Kurt Aaron Oration is the annual highlight of PAH Week. This year's orator, Professor Matt Sanders, is the Director of the Parenting and Family Support Centre at the University of Queensland and is considered a world leader in the field of evidence-based parenting intervention. He developed the renowned Triple P-Positive Parenting Program at UQ and his work has had a major local, national and international impact on parenting and child research, policy and practice. Triple P's global significance reaches over 35,000 practitioners worldwide who are trained to deliver the program. It's recognised as best practice in its field by the UN, World Health Organisation and many other top health authorities.

Welcome

On behalf of the Organising Committee, I welcome you to the Princess Alexandra Hospital Week 2010. The theme for this year is “Leading health in a changing world”.



The Princess Alexandra Hospital has been in existence for 54 years. Over this relatively short period of time, there have been enormous medical, technological, cultural and organisational advances. The PA Hospital has acquired international status in many areas, including liver and kidney transplantation, melanoma treatment, laparoscopic surgery, gout research and treatment, cardiovascular disease management and the vaccination for cervical cancer.

The focus for this year’s PAH Week will be on the challenges of continuing to improve patient management in a world that is changing in terms of the patients we are seeing; the diseases they have; evolving models of care and innovations in clinical management and our understanding of diseases.

We will consider the past and what has worked in terms of dealing with change as well as looking at new models of clinical care and practical improvements that are being undertaken at the hospital now. And we will look to the future – the exciting new research being performed on the PAH campus; the organisational and financial changes facing the hospital; and the promise of new technologies and techniques.

One of the major roles of the week is to highlight research on campus and there will be oral presentations for the annual Young Investigator Awards on two mornings, as well posters from researchers on campus.

This year also marks the 50th anniversary of the Princess Alexandra Hospital Society. The Society was initially established by medical staff to promote research and educational activities on campus, but has expanded with the times and is now open to all staff on campus with an interest in its goals. The Society is responsible for organising the keynote address of PAH Week, the Kurt Aaron Oration. This year we are fortunate to have secured Professor Matt Sanders, Director of the Parenting and Family Support Centre at The University of Queensland to deliver the oration. Prof Sanders is perhaps best known for developing the Triple P-Positive Parenting Program.

The title for this year’s oration is “Taking evidence based parenting interventions community wide: Lessons from large scale population trials”. The organising committee are excited that the oration will look at an internationally recognised and innovative program that has improved health in its broadest context within the general community.

The purpose of PAH Week is to have experts from all manner of clinical professions present their experiences to staff to promote quality care for patients and improve training of staff. As such, the organising committee has tried to feature a broad cross-section of disciplines and streams. PAH Week is meant to be for the whole community on campus. We have designed a program with something of interest for everyone on campus. Please get involved.




